

PERSONAL INFORMATION (If a New Client)

- O Your social security number or tax ID number
- O Your spouse's full name and social security number or tax ID number
- O Copy of last year's tax returns
- O Bank account # and routing # if direct depositing refunds

DEPENDENTS INFORMATION (If a New Client or any changes from last year)

- O Birthdates and social security numbers or tax ID numbers
- O Income of other adults in your home
- O Form 8332 showing release of right to claim child (if applicable)

TAX PAYMENTS

- O Record of estimated tax payments (Form 1040ES)
- O Record of any State estimated tax payments

INCOME SOURCES

- O Forms W-2
- O Unemployment, state tax refund (1099-G)

Self-Employed

- O QuickBooks accountant's copy or List of Income and Expenses by category
- O Forms 1099-MISC, Schedules K-1, income records to verify amounts not on 1099s
- O Expense records check registers, credit card statements, and receipts
- O Business-use asset description, cost, date placed in service of assets costing over \$500
- Office in home information total sq. ft. home, sq. ft. office, utilities, homeowner's insurance, etc.
- O SEP, Simple or other self-employed pension plans

Rental Income

- O Income and expense records
- O Rental asset cost, date placed in service, etc.



Retirement Income

- O Pension/IRA/Annuity Income (1099-R)
- O Traditional IRA basis amounts you contributed that were already taxed
- O Social Security/RRB income (1099-SSA, RRB-1099)

Saving & Investments or Dividends

- O Foreign bank account information (if applicable)
- O Interest, dividend Income (1099-INT, 1099-OID, 1099-DIV)
- O Income from sales of stock or other property (1099-B, 1099-S)
- O Acquisition dates and records of cost or other basis in property sold (if not reported on 1099-B)
- O Investment related expenses
- O Health savings account and long term care contributions and reimbursements (1099-SA or 1099-LTC)
- O Medical savings account contributions and reimbursements

Other Income & Losses

- O Gambling income (W-2G or records showing income, as well as expense records)
- O Prizes and awards
- O Hobby income and expenses
- O Jury Duty records
- O Trust information, including K-1's from trusts
- O Royalty income (1099 misc.)
- O Any other 1099s received, including 1099-C (cancellation of debt)
- Records of Alimony paid/received with ex-spouse's name and SSN
- O Copy of HUD-1 Settlement statement for any real estate sales

TYPES OF DEDUCTIONS

Home ownership

- O Forms 1098 or other mortgage interest statements
- O Real Estate and personal property tax records
- O Energy-saving home improvement receipts
- O All other 1098 series forms



Charitable Donations

- O Cash amounts donated to houses of worship, schools, or other charitable organizations
- O Non-cash charitable donation records
- O Miles driven for charitable or medical purposes

Out-of-pocket Medical Expenses (not paid through a flexible spending account at work or by employer)

- O Amounts paid for healthcare insurance
- O Amounts paid to doctors, dentists, hospitals
- Amounts paid for prescriptions
- O Miles driven for medical care

Health Insurance

- O From 1095-A if enrolled in an insurance plan through the Marketplace (Exchange)
- O Form 1095-B and/or 1095-C if you had insurance coverage through any other source (employer, insurance company, government health plan such as Medicare, Medicaid, CHIP, TRICARE, VA, etc.)
- O Marketplace exemption certificate if you applied for and received an exemption from the Marketplace (Exchange)

Childcare Expenses

- O Name, address and tax ID or Social Security Number for each provider
- O Fees paid to a licensed day care center or family day care of child under 13 years of age, when both parents employed

Educational Expenses

- O Forms 1098-T from educational institutions
- Receipts that itemize qualified educational expenses, including books, computers
- Records of scholarships or fellowships you received
- O Form 1098-E if you paid student loan interest

Job Expenses & Tax Prep Fees

- O Employment related vehicle expenses (tolls, mileage, gas, maintenance, license, property tax, interest expense, parking)
- O Receipts for classroom expenses (for educators in grades K-12)
- O Employment-related expenses (dues, publications, tools, uniform cost and cleaning, travel)



0	Job-	hunting	expenses
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- O Moving expenses not reimbursed by employer
- O Amount paid for last year's tax return preparation

State & Local Taxes or Sales Tax

- O State/local income tax paid (other than wage withholding), or state/local sales tax paid
- O Invoice showing amount of vehicle sales tax paid

Retirement & Other Savings

- O Form 5498-SA showing HSA contributions
- O Form 5498 showing IRA contributions (Regular and Roth)
- O All other 5498 series forms (5498-QA, 5498-ESA)

Federally Declared Disaster/Casualty and Theft

- O City/county you lived/worked/had property in
- O Records to support property losses (appraisal, clean-up costs, etc.)
- O Records of rebuilding/repair costs
- O Insurance reimbursements/claims to be paid
- O FEMA assistance information
- O Check FEMA site to see if your county has been declared a federal disaster area
- O Casualty and theft losses: amount of damage, insurance reimbursements
